Anthropology 2351 Final Exam Question Spring 2021

Description

Anthropology is a holistic four-field discipline with a shared philosophical perspective and methodological approach. Each of its fields, however, has a unique focus. Each is equally challenged in its ability to negotiate new technologies and practices of an ever-more interconnected world.

Ideological diversity has increased among cultural anthropologists, but a shared methodology is embraced by all that emphasizes avoiding ethnocentrism. Recently, the central focus has become a shared global environment, with growing concerns focused on the effects of globalization.

How is Cultural Anthropology uniquely equipped to study human cultural themes such as language, human origins, race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, kinship, family, marriage, class, inequality, the global economy, religion, health, illness, the body, arts, and media? Give at least 5 examples with evidence.
