- 1. Why are movies worthy of serious study, as opposed to being merely an outlet for escape or entertainment? Please explain in a 3 to 5 sentence response.
- 2. How might a film's lighting influence the audience to feel about a character? Offer (2) examples, one from the text as well as an example from one of our assigned films.
- 3. Why is there is no such thing as a purely objective documentary? Please explain in 2 to 5 sentences.
- 4. Explain in 2 to 5 sentences how an inciting incident, or catalyst, moves a typical narrative forward. Please give an example from one of the assigned films.
- 5. What is the difference between diegetic and nondiegetic elements? Give an example of each from one of the assigned films.
- 6. Using examples from the text and assigned films, explain in a few sentences how the use of costumes, hairstyles, and makeup can contribute to an actor's overall performance and to the audience's perception of that character.
- 7. What are the differences between a shot, a take, and a setup? How are they related?

- 8. In a few sentences, explain how actors breathe life into the characters they play? Provide an example from the text or an assigned film of how an actor prepares for a role.
- 9. Using a single movie scene from the textbook or an assigned film, explain the difference between the technique, craft, and art of editing.
- 10. Explain the factors and changes that transformed Hollywood in the postwar period and brought about the New American Cinema.
- 11. What is the key factors in the marketing and distribution of a film?
- 12. How has film impacted your life? What is your favorite film and why?
